# LOG A LOAD For Kids

Corner Brook Pulp and Paper Woodlands staff, contractors and employees have had some innovative fund raising ideas resulting in an increased awareness of the **Log A Load For Kids** Program in Newfoundland.



- Again in 2004, GIS Technician **Ray Brake** held a Hockey Pool raising \$622.
- **New Venture Logging** held a fundraising draw during which tickets were sold on donated items, including a chainsaw purchased by New Venture loggers. This fundraiser was in memory of crewmember Willie Vincent, who passed away in 2003. And again this year, each logger donated wood they had cut- raising \$3000.
- **D & T Mechanical Ltd.** once again cut and sold tickets on a tractor-trailer load of birch firewood - raising \$5000.
- **Northwest Forest Resources Inc.**'s entire crew got together on a weekend and donated the value of all wood harvested in 1 day- raising \$2000.
- Once again **Nobles Lumber Yard** have generously donated the value of a load of pulpwood - \$1035.
- In addition to these efforts, several brave **Woodlands staff** members took part in a fundraiser for the Janeway Telethon. Jamie Kennedy, Bruce Yates, Brian Green, Wes Morgan, Ray Brake, Deon & Terriann Hamlyn, Steve and Barbara Balsom collected sponsor money, donned wetsuits, and braved the icy water and entered the “Humber River Tube Race.” They not only survived, they had a great time and raised \$1056.



The amount raised this year is \$12 713 - bringing the total contribution to the Janeway Children’s Hospital by CBPP Contractors and staff since 2001 to \$45 293!
